



Questions To Be Addressed CPP Work Session—Cerro Coso College

1. Can we modify the existing Industrial Tech Core requirements without negatively affecting other programs requiring the same core?
2. Can we substitute a Wind Tech requirement for the Welding core required course?
3. Can a Wind Tech course be substituted for the General Education Diversity requirement?
4. Do we need all the Wind Tech courses? Can some be combined? Can some be integrated with other required courses?
5. Can Wind Tech and related courses be modularized to better respond to incumbent worker learning needs at the entry and full-performance levels?
6. Is there any content missing from any of the courses that is needed to perform the Wind Technician tasks?
7. Do we want to abandon the “Core Plus” approach and develop a stand-alone Wind Technician degree program?
8. No internship or capstone course was identified in the work session—should it be added?
9. Can the current 8-week non-credit course (boot camp) be articulated into the proposed program to encourage those students to continue their career development using the credit program?
10. Can the degree program exceed 60 units? If so, by how much?
11. How can we address some of the course delivery issues and needs that were identified:
 - a. Shorter course time frames
 - b. More hands-on learning experiences
 - c. New/different delivery options—modular courses, weekend college, on-line coursework
